DOWNTOWN COWBOY quickly took command, set the pace under good handling and was kept to strong left-handed urging. HOLLYWOOD TALENT pressed the early pace on the inside, angled out three-wide into the stretch and finished well. COPPERPLATE raced outside in the second flight, rallied three-wide on the turn, came wider in the upper stretch and had a mild rally. ATHELSTANE was never far back, fanned six-wide and had a mild rally. TRIPLE CROSS was well placed early and tired. SEUSS stumbled at the start and trailed.
