SNOW WAY set the pace just off the rail, drew off around the turn, widened under urging. VICTORY MORNING pressed the issue three wide and while no match for the winner was clearly second best. SUAVE LASSIE forced the pace three wide, lacked a late response. PHYL'S NOTEBOOK advanced four wide but was too late. NO CAMERAS PLEASE never was a factor, inside. RISQUE'S DANCER was used up after a half on the rail. EAST LONDON flashed brief foot, four wide.
