SWAMPOODLE prompted the issue along the rail, angled out for the drive then was up in the final strides. KIMBALEE moved up three wide, loomed boldly on the turn, hung in the drive. BLUE SATIN SASH set the pace under heavy pressure, led until deep stretch. I WANT THREE with the pace just off the rail, lacked a late response. VICTORY MORNING in tight and squeezed back at the start, saved ground but had no rally. MY PARK AVENUE never was a factor, three wide. RISQUE'S DANCER rushed to contention but was used up after a half and not abused through the stretch.
